Questions 1-4: General experience and motivation

1. How and when did you first become involved in Cochrane and what has been your subsequent contribution to Cochrane's work (maximum 200 words)?

I got involved in Cochrane in 2001 when I was a clinical fellow for an international trial, evaluating intravenous globulin therapy (IVIG) in neonatal sepsis, co-ordinated from the National Perinatal Epidemiology Unit (NPEU), Oxford, U.K. I attended a workshop on performing systematic reviews at the Cochrane Center, next door to the NPEU and I got hooked. I have since authored 13 Cochrane reviews (another 4 in preparation) for the Cochrane Neonatal. My systematic reviews involve co-authors from all over the world including Australia, Europe, USA and Asia. I have enjoyed and cherished the learning experience interacting with all colleagues in the Cochrane collaboration, across the world.

I was selected as an Associate Editor since 2018, assisting in the editorial committee of the Cochrane Neonatal. I have since directed the Evidence Academy at Texas Children's Hospital & Baylor College of Medicine. The Evidence Academy fosters evidence-based practice in my institution, instructing workshops on performing Cochrane reviews both reviews on interventions and diagnostic tests, with the help of Roger Soll MD & Prakesh Shah MD from Cochrane Neonatal and Yemisi Takwoingi PhD and Mariska Leeflang PhD from the Cochrane DTA.

2. What experience do you have serving as a member of a governing board, board of directors, management group or similar? I direct the Evidence Academy at my institution interacting with other leaders, working together for the benefit of the faculty at Baylor College of Medicine. I also lead the international collaboration Center for Best evidence in Medical Education (BEME) at Texas Children's Hospital, working together with institutional leaders and faculty and internationally with other collaboration centres across the world. This collaboration work is exemplified by 2 educational reviews highlighting the change in educational activities during the Covid pandemic published in the journal, Medical Teacher.

I am an associate editor for the Cochrane Neonatal and serve on the editorial board for the journals 'Pediatric Research' and 'Journal of neonatal Perinatal Medicine' which has enriched by experience in scientific publishing and doing collaborative work.

3. I have been an active member for the Texas Pediatric Society and its committees on Committee of the Fetus and Newborn, Education and Infectious Diseases.

I have been the Medical Director for a large Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, in a tertiary hospital (Jan 2017 to July 2021) which has enabled me to learn administrative tasks, lead meetings, plan things forward.

I serve on the Perinatal mortality committee, Fellowship committee for my section, Faculty committee on admissions to the MD, PhD program, Norton-Rose Fulbright educational excellence awards committee and Star Award of excellence committee at Baylor College of Medicine. Serving in these committees has enhanced my values of collaborative work, decision making for a larger body than myself and help the whole organization.

4. What do you think would make you an effective member of the Cochrane Governing Board (maximum 200 words)?

My ability to form collaborations both at the level of the hospital, college, nationally and internationally will be a great asset to the Cochrane governing board. I have been acknowledged as a great team player and I work to form a consensus that will make me gel with other members of the board. My previous role as a medical director has drilled into me a strong work ethic in the importance of meeting deadlines.

My experience with national organizations and journals, in administration and multiple hospital-wide committees will stand me in good stead in working with others on the governing board.

I have been known to be a soft-spoken person who interacts with everyone in a productive way. My personal attributes of consensus building, problem-solving, being friendly and affable will help me work with other members of the team.
