Questions 1-4: Skills, experience and motivation

 Can you demonstrate your commitment to Cochrane's mission, vision and founding principles? (link- About us | Cochrane) (maximum 200 words)

Cochrane's vision for a world with better health for all people where decisions about health and care are informed by high-quality evidence & of promoting evidence-based decision-making in healthcare are reflected in my activities as a Co-chair of the Cochrane India Network and Director of the ICMR Cochrane Affiliate Centre. I have initiated a unique funding opportunity for Indian authors in systematic reviews and meta-analyses on key priority health areas of the National Health Policy, Perinatal Maternal Child and Adolescent health. In the high priority area of anemia among women of reproductive age and children 28 systematic reviews were coordinated by our Centre that contributed towards revision of the national program "Anemia Mukt Bharat 2.0" (anemia free India). This aligns with Cochrane's vision of improving health outcomes through high-quality, accessible research evidence. My commitment is also reflected in efforts to build capacity of Indian Scientists in Cochrane systematic review through workshops organized by the ICMR-Cochrane Affiliate Centre. I firmly believe in furthering Cochrane's founding principles of collaboration, inclusivity, and transparency in global health research. My work consistently promotes the dissemination and application of Cochrane reviews to inform public health policy.

2. How have you contributed to Cochrane's work? (maximum 200 words)

My contributions to Cochrane's work span authorship, training, and leadership roles. As a Cochrane author of

Neonatal, Acute Respiratory groups, have published Cochrane systematic reviews including the prestigious Kenneth Warren award-winning review on chlorhexidine for neonatal care. I am an author in two ongoing reviews with the Campbell Social Welfare & Campbell International Development Groups. I am a group member with Cochrane's Trainer's network, Cochrane Child Health, and a peer reviewer for the Acute respiratory infections group. I have contributed to Workshops and Abstracts committees for Cochrane colloquium in (2023, 2024).

As the Director of the ICMR Cochrane Affiliate Centre I facilitate capacity building by training scientists and clinicians in systematic reviews through Cochrane-supported series of workshops. As Co-chair of the India Cochrane Network, I have fostered collaborations with key stakeholders, initiated projects like the Anemia Mukt Bharat Program, and played a role in producing evidence and gap maps to prioritize research needs in child health. Additionally, I actively participate in peer review for Cochrane groups, contributing to maintaining the high standards of Cochrane outputs. I have now been made a sign off editor with the Cochrane Central Editorial.

This would be a new role for me. I plan to do my homework by reading the outputs created by my predecessors_and_by communicating with the existing Board directors. This would help me gain insights and learn about the collaborative approach. In my role as Deputy Director General at the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), I routinely contributed to collective decisions that balanced diverse stakeholder perspectives. For example, while coordinating the ICMR task force on anemia reduction, I facilitated consensus among researchers, funders, and government representatives to ensure the research's focus aligned with national health priorities. By fostering an environment of open discussion, I ensured that decisions reflected the group's best interest and maintained objectivity. In governing roles, including my work with Cochrane, as a Co-Chair of the Cochrane India Network, I consistently prioritize CIN's goals and ensure that decision-making processes remain transparent, collaborative, and free from personal biases. I have initiated_collaboration with NITI Aayog, Global Centre of Traditional Medicine (GCTM), and Campbell Collaboration to support and develop technology based on Evidence based medicine. NITI Aayog approached CIN to produce synthesized evidence on topics of national priorities.

4. What skills, experience and personal qualities do you have to enable you to serve as an effective member of the Cochrane Governing Board? (maximum 200 words)

I bring over three decades of experience in public health research, leadership, and evidence synthesis, particularly in maternal and child health. As a Program officer in Child Health at the Division of Reproductive, Maternal and Child Health at the ICMR New Delhi, I contributed to advance the research agenda of the Division in the areas of Newborn & Child Health, Child Nutrition, Paediatric HIV, and Evidence Based Medicine. I have coordinated research opportunities to bring out effective strategies for prevention and control of morbidities among women and children. I have expanded the scope of research in Child Health in the areas of Childhood and

Adolescent Anaemia, Injuries, Social Paediatrics' issues -Children living in difficult circumstances, Prevention and management of Prematurity, role of Probiotics in Women's and child Health and Evidence Based Child Health by advertising calls for proposals. I was responsible for research management of investigator-initiated research projects supported by ICMR. My skills in research management, strategic planning, and capacity building are complemented by a strong background in epidemiology and biostatistics. I am committed to Cochrane's principles of evidence-based healthcare and have a proven track record of promoting collaborative research environments. My leadership roles in Cochrane, as well as my extensive experience in global health projects, equip me with the necessary skills to navigate complex decision-making processes while maintaining a collaborative and transparent approach. Colleagues describe me as a quick learner with good interpersonal skills.

I have received several international fellowships and awards, including the Joint Global Health Trials award from MRC UK, Fogarty International Fellowship, Aubrey Sheiham Public Health & Primary care, WHO-Cornell Fellowship and the Kenneth Warren Award, recognizing my contributions to evidence synthesis and public health.

My experience spans not only academic research but also policy impact, as evidenced by my role in initiatives such as the Anemia Mukt Bharat Program, and my participation in the ICMR's strategic health initiatives. I have a strong track record in stakeholder engagement, policy translation, and the creation of high-impact research outcomes that inform national health programs.

As a Governing Board member, I would bring my extensive network, strategic leadership skills, and a commitment to promoting Cochrane's mission of advancing healthcare through evidence. I am passionate about scaling Cochrane's work globally, ensuring inclusivity, and supporting the organization in its pursuit of delivering reliable health information for all.
