I joined the then Cochrane South Asian Centre and Network in 2004 when I attended a Protocol development workshop. Since then I have been a team member of two full Cochrane reviews and working on a third at the moment.

Now I am the Director of the Clinical Epidemiology Unit and BV Moses Center at the Christian Medical College, Vellore. This center runs Protocol development, manuscript completion, Search as well as EBM workshops. We run 5-6 per year and assist many authors in the region. I teach the protocol development as well as Risk of Bias.

We have started a rapid review course this year.

I have been a Governing body member of the Indian Society of Health Administrators that teaches hospital management.
